1. SCHOOL DIVISION OVERVIEW

The Lloydminster R.C.S.S.D. #89 is a legal body charged with the responsibility to provide educational services to children in the geographic area we serve. The Division is governed by an elected seven member Board that employs staff to operate the Division on a day to day basis.

Through the Director of Education, school principals implement the educational policies of the Board. The principals are responsible for the staff and operation of a particular school.

The Lloydminster R.C.S.S. Division has a teaching staff of 125.63 teachers (full-time equivalents) and a support staff of 130. The Division services the City of Lloydminster and had 1,979 pupils in the 2011-2012 school year, enrolled in the Pre K – Grade 12 programs in five schools.

2. INTRODUCTION TO THE PUBLIC ACCOUNTS

The public accounts for the Lloydminster R.C.S.School Division have been prepared in accordance with Section 277.1 of *The Education Act* and the applicable regulations. They are intended to present the operating details of the Division in complimentary fashion to the audited financial statements.

To better inform the public and to avoid unnecessary duplication, the Division has summarized some of the details in the audited statements, such as revenue and expenditures. In other instances additional information which is not contained in the financial statements, such as the ownership of busses, has been included in these public accounts.

These accounts are based on the audited financial statements and should be used in conjunction with them. However, as there is no requirement for them to be audited, they are unaudited.

3. PUBLIC ACCOUNTS LEGISLATION

These public accounts have been prepared according to section 277.1 of <u>The</u> *Education Act* and the corresponding *Regulations*.

The intent of the public accounts is to make the operation of the School Division more meaningful and understandable to parents, staff and the public at large, and to provide greater accountability to the ratepayers whose taxes provide a significant portion of the Division's revenue.

In general, the public accounts of the Lloydminster R.C.S. School Division present complementary information about the Division not contained in the audited financial statement or in other documents prepared by the Division such as the annual budget.
