Have you ever wondered about what your children are learning or how the school day is structured and what programs are available? Do your kids stay for lunch? Do you worry about your children walking to school? How does safety patrolling work? Do you wonder how emergency or safety issues are handled and communicated? Would you like to have input on the decisions that affect your children? These are all topics that our School Community Councils can be involved in.

Each year, the School Community Councils (SCC) holds an Annual General Meeting (AGM) to reflect on the accomplishments of the school year and hold elections for the next school year.

To facilitate a smooth transition from one year to the next, the SCC has the AGM with elections in spring. Nominations of parents/guardians and community members interested in standing for election can occur through *advanced nominations* or *nominations from the floor*. Nomination forms can be picked up and submitted at the school office.
